December 28, 2021 - Day 21 Tuesday

We are in Portsmouth, VA at the Ocean Yacht Marina located on the Elizabeth River.

Using the boat's built-in oil change system he pumped the used oil into the black buckets.

Reversing the cycle he used the same pump

system to pump the new oil out of the white buckets.

Doing it this way allowed him to have a safe secured, sealed container to transport the used oil off the boat.







New oil filters are in place.

Remember that we have two Detroit Diesel engines so this process had to be done twice!

We dropped the oil at an Auto Zone right here in Portsmouth and then off to the Norfolk Airport to drop the car 1600 miles older; then an uber ride back to the boat.

In addition to the oil and oil filter change Mark also cleaned the screen filter on the gearboxes. Cleaning the screen is a once in 1000 hour job so nice to have that done and off the 'to-do' list.

It is t-shirt weather today and we did steal about 30 minutes of sun and relaxation on the back deck while Haleigh 'undecorated' the tree. Doing so always sparks an emotion inside me that is a combination of depression and relief. I hate putting the Holiday Season away for another year but it is nice to reclaim what little space I have in the salon that the Christmas tree was taking up. The tree went up earlier than normal this year and is coming down earlier than normal. 2021 has been anything but normal so why try to start now.



Tomorrow Haleigh and I are going to venture out and take a short ½ mile trek to a grocery store and post office while Mark installs a chain locker check valve fitting and is going to top off hydraulic steering fluid and air pressure. At some point over the next couple of days, we are going to wash the boat in what is predicted to be 70-degree weather!
