



January 3, 2022 – Monday, Day 27. Still in Portsmouth, VA

What a lousy night's sleep. We had wind and rain come into Portsmouth which started rocking us just enough so that the lines creaked, doors were rattling and the rain sounded like large water balloons hitting the deck. It was 4:00 a.m. so perhaps being a little cranky about being awake at this hour exaggerated the sounds but we were rolling enough that Mark had to get up and take the gangway down. As you may remember we do not fit into this slip perfectly so our gangway ladder is in line with the pump-out station and with the right amount of pitch our ladder hits up against it. Not wanting to cause damage to either, Mark took it down.



There are plenty of schools that have either canceled, delayed openings, or are closing early all along the east coast up through and including Massachusetts. We are expecting snow later this afternoon. Yesterday at 4:00 p.m. I went for a walk on the riverfront in a t-shirt and today I am bundled up in long sleeves and sweatpants. Mark is making calls this morning to find a boatyard that can pull our boat and work on the stabilizer. Today Mark installed the chain locker drain check valve:

We had a plastic check valve for the chain locker drain line when we bought the boat. On our way to Atlantic City, NJ, in rough seas, Mark noticed bilge pumps kept activating. Upon investigation, he found the plastic check valve was cracked and leaking heavily every time we hit a wave. Mark used emergency repair tape to stem the leak until we had a chance to repair it properly. Today is that chance. Here is a video of us replacing the chain locker drain hose & check valve and installing a new check valve which took care of the flooding problem.
