Welcome! Glad to have you here!

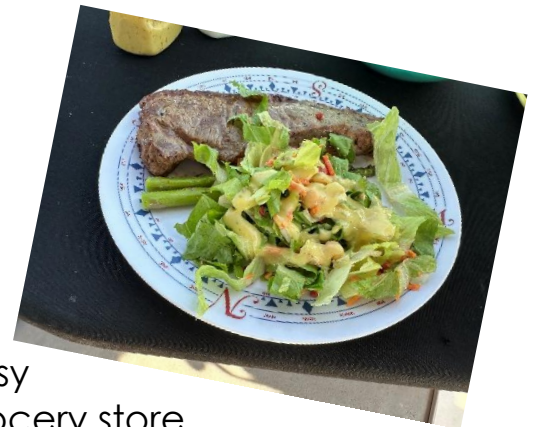

Within a short 10-minute walk is a grocery store, restaurants, a laundromat, a hardware store, a resort, a beach, beautiful parks, and miles of biking and walking trails. There's even a dog park for four-legged



crew members and a playground for the kids. It's the kind of place that's easy to settle into—and hard to leave.

Frankfort, Michigan, is a charming small town situated on the shores of Lake Michigan. The downtown area is characterized by a variety of quaint shops, restaurants, and cafes, all housed in historic buildings. Visitors can stroll through the streets and enjoy the beautiful views of the harbor and lake, as well as the colorful Victorian-style homes. One of the town's most popular attractions is the Frankfort lighthouse, which has stood on the harbor's south breakwater since 1912.
